How We Work: 5-C Model


Convene	Bring people together around accessing and completing an education beyond high school + invite partners to participate





2019 Strategic Refresh & Lessons Learned


- Steady long-term goals, evolving strategies.

- Representation, inclusivity and collaboration are key to our success.

2020: Barriers & Challenges

- Volunteer Leadership Transitions
 - Several vacant co-chair positions
 - Some new partners with less historical knowledge of the work
- Staff Turnover & Reduction
 - Executive Director Transition in March 2020, then vacated July 2020
 - From 3.25 staff positions to <1</p>
- Backbone Transition
 - July 2020 United Way of PBC announced its role change, effective October 2020
 - Negotiations are underway with Palm Beach State College, with a final decision anticipated later this month

- Healthcare crisis
- Economic crisis

- Uncertainty in education system
 - Emergency distance learning protocols
 - Suspension of testing standards
 - Strained resources
 - Evolving plans for summer/fall

2020 Results

- Student Urgent Relief Fund (SURF) piloted by Palm Beach State College
 - 84 awards totaling \$33,952.71
 - Inspired the Panther TRUE Fund to complement efforts to support students
- AMP Program wrapping up one-year pilot at Palm Beach State College
- Starting a deep-dive asset mapping effort of network partners
- Apprenticeship Inventory nearly complete
 - Open-house style events being promoted for additional awareness
- Many other team Goals progressing more slowly or on hold
 - Data & Evaluation Plan postponed until after backbone transition




GRADUATION RATES

SEAMLESS ENROLLMENT


% of District Graduates Enrolled in 2- and 4-Year Postsecondary Institutions in the Fall after Graduation by Student Subgroup


PERSISTENCE

Percentage of District High School Graduates who return to college at any institution for their second year




6-YEAR COMPLETION

FY10 to FY12 for the District High School Graduates Enrolled in Postsecondary Institutions and Degree Completion Rate in Six Years by Demographic Groups




Seamless Enrollment by District School

FY 2013/14 through FY 2018/19




First-Year Persistence by District School

6-Year Completion by District School



Using Data Strategically

- Identify systemic barriers and challenges to student success
- Use data to determine areas of focus
- Capture a variety of data to get a more complete picture of the system
 - ► K-12 School District, Charter Schools, Private, Home School, Alternative
 - Higher Education Institutions
 - Workforce & Economic data
 - Data from Achieve PBC and Birth to 22 Alliance partners
- Complete a full data and evaluation plan
 - More frequent measurement and analysis
 - Incorporating data into strategy conversations
