### Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Culture of Health Prize







The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation is the nation's largest philanthropy dedicated solely to health. They seek to improve health and health care of all Americans. In recent years they have placed a strong emphasis on the social determinants of health.

The Culture of Health Prize started in 2013 and recognizes communities working at the forefront of advancing health, opportunity, and equity for all. It is a collaboration with the University of Wisconsin's Population Health Institute. The prize honors communities – urban, rural, tribal, large or small – that are beacons of hope and progress for healthier people, families and places.





- Fall 2020 nearly 200 communities submitted Phase 1 application
- Dec. 2020 21 communities invited to move to Phase 2



Spring 2021 – 9 Finalists selected





# **2021** Priorities

- Focus on aligning policies and institutional practices in
  2021 by continuing to anchor racial equity as a core value
- Infuse parenting and role model strategies across all B22 Action Teams
- Expand cross action teamwork. Increase collaborations and plan for mutual achievement of our goals
- Transition B22 from a management paradigm to a movement building paradigm as a principle of Collective Impact 3.0





# Proposed 2022 B-22 Alliance Priorities

- Increased Marketing and Communication
- Strengthen equity centered practices and advocacy for racial equity in the community
- Planning for Youth Master Plan and Youth Survey refresh
- Sustained Engagement—increase meaningful connections with parents, youth and community
  - o Relaunch Parenting Supports & Role Models Action Team
  - Broaden reach and strength of Future Leaders and Girls Coordinating Council
- Strategic Partnering—examine and align work of B-22 with other community initiatives and coalitions
  - o Operationalize efforts to build/sustain a Culture Health
  - o Greater alignment and movement building with other collective impact initiatives



# Proposed 2022 Action Team Priorities

- <u>Achieve Success In Higher Education</u>: Finalize transition to Palm Beach State College; Reignite workgroups to accomplish workgroup objectives
- <u>Access to Health and Wellness</u>: Compile a resource guide to identify insurance assistance and safe spaces for youth in PBC
- <u>Becoming a Trauma Sensitive Community</u>: Increase participation in Get Your Green On; Expand reach to law enforcement, first responders and non-English speaking community members
- <u>Economic Access</u>: Increasing agency participation in Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) process
- <u>Engagement Team</u>: Host Community Conversations; strengthen and expand Communication Subcommittee; develop centralized data platform





# Proposed 2022 Action Team Priorities

- <u>Education to Employment Pathways for Disconnected Youth</u>: Identify and align databases to access resources
- <u>Ensuring Safety and Justice</u>: Implementation of Enhanced Mentoring Initiative in PBC; Publication of a pro-social resource directory for target population; Production of a Safety and Justice infographic
- <u>Future Leaders</u>: Develop and implement outreach strategies to connect with youth and sustain youth engagement
- <u>Girls Coordinating Council</u>: Strengthening GCC Network and completing second network analysis survey; hosting an event to highlight findings from network analysis survey and Girls Voice Task force members





# Proposed 2022 Action Team Priorities

- <u>Racial Equity:</u> Continue supporting Advancing the Mission's Learning Cohorts to implement proven practices and replicate success, changing the norm of what is expected and possible to advance racial equity in Palm Beach County.
- <u>Social Emotional Learning</u>: Build SEL capacity among youth serving organizations, youth/teen leaders and families; scale SEL practices and competencies in the school day and out-of-school time setting community-wide and educate national and local stakeholders in the field on best practices
- <u>Strengthening Out of School Time</u>: Reactivating the OST team; Integrating the changes and adjustments made over the last year into the current and future group objectives; Redefining the team's objectives and move toward implementation
